Since 2013, Mental Health is cited as the No. 1 priority in Berrien County's Community Health Needs Assessment.



Recent figures show up to 1 in 4 individuals in our county faces mental health challenges, regardless of age, gender, or background. The report calls for the creation of accessible services & programs to help prevent or address mental health.



2024-25 EXPENSE




2024-25 REVENUE
